Legacy Giving

**You've helped us remember the past.
Help us continue the work into the future.**

Your family and loved ones come first. There is never any pressure to leave a gift.

Why leave a legacy?

For many Britain Palestine Project supporters, concern for Palestine is a commitment built over decades. You may have supported efforts to understand Britain's historical responsibility, ensure Palestinian history is not forgotten, educate new generations, challenge misinformation and advocate for a just peace.

Leaving a gift in your Will is one way to carry that commitment forward. It creates continuity between one generation of supporters and the next: the people may change, but the work can continue.

A legacy gift is not simply a donation. It is a way of helping ensure that the values and work you have supported during your lifetime can continue for generations to come.

What your legacy could make possible

A gift in your Will can help equip Britain Palestine Project to continue making a difference through history, education, public engagement and advocacy.

- Preserve and share the history of Britain and Palestine, ensuring that it is not forgotten.
- Create films, podcasts, talks and educational resources that make complex history accessible to new audiences.
- Bring Palestinian, British and international voices into informed public debate.
- Challenge misinformation with evidence, historical context and informed analysis.
- Engage Parliament, policymakers and the wider public.
- Advocate for a just peace grounded in international law, security and equal rights for Palestinians and Israelis.
- Give future generations the tools to understand the past and help shape a more just future.

Every legacy matters. It is not the size of the gift that makes it meaningful; it is the decision to help carry the work forward.

Ways to leave a gift

After providing for your family and loved ones, there are several common ways you may choose to remember Britain Palestine Project in your Will. Your solicitor can advise you on the option that best suits your circumstances.

A percentage of your estate

You can leave a percentage or share of your estate. Because it is expressed as a proportion rather than a fixed amount, this type of gift can adapt as the value of your estate changes.

A share of what remains

You can leave Britain Palestine Project a share of what remains of your estate after other gifts, costs and commitments have been met.

A fixed sum

You can choose to leave a specific amount of money.

You can change your Will, or change your mind about a legacy gift, at any time.

Suggested wording for your solicitor

The exact legal wording should be agreed with your solicitor. Before using any wording, please confirm Britain Palestine Project's exact registered charity name, charity number and address.

You could tell your solicitor: "I would like to consider including a gift to Britain Palestine Project in my Will. Please advise me on the most appropriate way to do this while ensuring that my family and loved ones remain my first priority."

If you are not ready to make changes now, you can also ask your solicitor to make a note to discuss a charitable gift the next time you review your Will.

Frequently Asked Questions

Do I need to be wealthy to leave a legacy?

No. A legacy does not have to be large to be meaningful. You can leave a percentage, a share of what remains, or a fixed sum.

Should my family come first?

Yes. Always. We encourage you to provide for your family and loved ones first and only then consider whether you would like to include a gift to Britain Palestine Project.

Do I have to tell Britain Palestine Project?

No. You are under no obligation to tell us that you have included BPP in your Will.

Can I change my mind?

Yes. You can change your Will or remove a legacy gift at any time.

Will Britain Palestine Project tell me how much to leave?

No. We will never tell you how much to leave. The decision is entirely yours.

What if I already have a Will?

You can speak to your solicitor about the most appropriate way to update it. You do not necessarily need to wait until you make an entirely new Will.

Do I need a solicitor?

We recommend taking professional legal advice when making or changing a Will so that your wishes are recorded clearly and correctly.

How will my gift be used?

Legacy gifts can help sustain BPP's work across history, education, public engagement and advocacy, helping the organisation continue making a difference for future generations.

Our promise to you

If you choose to remember Britain Palestine Project in your Will:

- Your family and loved ones come first.
- We will never pressure you to leave a gift.
- We will never tell you how much to leave.
- You can change your mind at any time.
- You do not have to tell us that you have included BPP in your Will.
- Whatever the size of your gift, it will be deeply appreciated.

Tell us about your legacy – if you'd like to

You do not need to tell us if you have included Britain Palestine Project in your Will. Your decision can remain completely private.

If you would like to let us know, however, we would be very grateful to hear from you. Knowing that supporters intend to remember BPP can help us understand the long-term support for our work and gives us an opportunity to thank you.

Telling us is not binding. You remain free to change your mind at any time, and you do not need to tell us the amount or details of your gift.
